The hole at the top of the needle is called an 'eye' we push our thread through here. A running stitch is a stitch that goes up and down. Up through the material and down through the material. We tie at knot and the end of our thread to keep our stitch in place. 	

Our Curriculum Journey	Journey: This unit links to our English Class Reader - <i>Katie Morag Delivers The Mail</i> . The children will have learnt that Katie Morag goes on a journey to deliver post around the Island of Struay but drops and loses her letters. The children will be tasked with researching, designing and making Katie a new mail bag. The children will learn how to join felt together by folding it and using a running stitch as well as adding a button to ensure the bag is secure. Towards the end of this unit, the children will evaluate their mail bag.
