This half term, our topic is **Crafty Criminals** through **Crime and Punishment** and we will be focussing our learning around the key question **"What does 1000 years of crime and punishment look like?"**

Our 'Stunning Start' to launch our topic will be:

We will enhance children's learning and 'Cultural Capital' with the following experiences:

English:

Key texts:

Computing: We will be looking at AR and VR as well as online safety with the focus on phishing and avoiding scams

History: We will be looking at how crime and punishment has changed over the last 1000s years in Britain.

RE: Children will explore the question: What do Christians believe is the most important event that has ever happened?

DT: Levers, gears and pulleys. The children will be planning, designing and making inventions to catch a criminal. They will make a prototype and then in groups make a large scale model.
