This half term, our topic is on the '**Ourselves**' and we will be focusing our learning around the key question *What is school like for a Year 1 child*?

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Here is a breakdown of the skills and knowledge to be covered in each subject through this topic:

English:

Key texts: 'The Gingerbread Man' **Key skills:** -Story Structure

-non-fiction books and writing

-Labelling, writing lists and captions

-Capital Letters

-Full stops

-Adjectives

-Phonics

-Retelling stories by heart using actions

Maths: key topics:

Counting and ordering numbers to 20 Using number lines More than and Less than Number bonds to 10 Number patterns (counting in 2s, 5s and 10s) 2D and 3D shapes

Days of the week **Science:** Children will learn about the five senses (sight, touch, hearing, taste and smell).

Suggested trips/places to visit:

- Your local area/park
- The science museum

Geography: Children will use simple observational skills to study the classroom, playground and their local area. They will create simple maps and begin to ask simple geographical questions.

RE: Children will studying the religion of Sikhism and asking the question "What makes faith buildings special?"

Art: Children will be using pencil, paint and oil pastels while learning new drawing skills

PE: Music: Children will use their voices quietly and creatively by singing songs no louder than their speaking voice and speaking chants and rhymes. We will learn how to play a beat on untuned percussion instruments.

PSHE: Children will be learning about the Jigsaw piece 'Being Me in My World'. They will learn about what it means to belong, how it feels to achieve and about choices and consequences.

Computing: The children will be learning to programme a robot maze game.
