Staff will encourage the development of social skills, helping children to begin to develop their sense of responsibility and become more outgoing in the safe context of our setting. We will encourage children to extend and elaborate on their play ideas.

Understanding of the World

Nursery will have the opportunity to explore how different things work. They will be encouraged to discuss the differences between materials and any changes they observe.

Physical Development

The children will be have the chance to revise and refine the skills they have learnt such as running, hopping, skipping and climbing, both in the outdoor area and during PE lessons that take place on a Friday.

Expressive Arts and Design

In addition to the small world play and pretend play that they will have access to in the classroom, children will be encouraged to represent their ideas through song, movement and colour. We look forward to sharing some of our creations with you.
