Dear Families,

We hope that you enjoy the Christmas break. We are looking forward to our new term and continuing all of our wonderful learning. Please see below for details about what we will learn and ways in which you can support your child at home. Science and History coverage is outlined on the 'Knowledge Organisers'.

Next half term, our topic is The Romans and we will be focusing our learning around the key question 'Why did the Romans invade Britain'

Our 'Stunning start' to launch our topic will be:

We will be visiting The Verulamium in St Albans to step back into British Roman history. Our trip date We will enhance children's learning and 'Cultural Capital' with the following experiences, websites and texts:

- We will be reading Julius Zebra- (Rumble with the Romans)
- We will be exploring the short animation-Hope On The Boat to stimulate writing outcomes
- Trip to The Verulamium
- Weekly drama lessons
- RE Day
- African Drumming



Here is a breakdown of the skills and knowledge to be covered in each subject through this topic:

English:

Key texts: Julius Zebra 'Rumble with the Romans' **Key skills:** Graphic novels, persuasive

writing, narratives

We will be continuing to have explicit grammar, reading and writing lessons. This half term we will look at metaphors, onomatopoeia, inverted commas for speech and adverbs. We will be writing a monster tale and creating a comic strip.

Maths:

We be practising our times tables and maths passports targets. **Key topics:** Multiplication and division Units of measure

Science: In science, the children will be looking at rocks and fossils answering the key question, What are the differences between rocks, fossils and soils?

History: Children will be covering The Romans around the key question 'Why did the Romans invade Britain'

RE: Children will be learning about Islam answering the question 'Should Holy books be treated differently?'.

Art: The children will be looking at Roman mosaics and will create their own.

PE: Children will be learning football skills and dance skills with the stimulus of 'wild animals;

Music: Children will be starting African Drumming lessons

PSHE: Children will complete the unit of 'Dream and Goals'. They will talk about aspirations.

French: Children will learn begin to learn about weather and the seasons

Computing: Children will be focussing on video creation. They will be answering the key question How can I create a video using voiceovers?
