Key Facts/Sticky Knowledge	We can remember people in lots of different ways like love, memories, birthdays, anniversaries and photos.  Humanists do not believe in a god. They believe that science explains how the world was created.  Humanists believe we have one life and we should make the most of this life doing positive things like helping others as we go.  Christians remember religious people through pictures like 'The Last Supper' and 'The Nativity'.
